Alkaff Bridge

The first of the three footbridges to be built at the turn of the 20th century, the eye-catching Alkaff Bridge was repainted in 2004 by the late Philippine artist Pacita Abad and her team using 52 different colours and more than 900 litres of paint.



Shaped like a *tongkang*, the 55-metre long bridge is situated near the former Alkaff Quay. The Quay was named after a prominent Arab family, the Alkaffs, who were among the wealthiest in Singapore during the early 20th century.
