
# Gwangju Biennale Announces 69 Participating Artists

Forty-one new works have been commissioned to help develop the theme of 'Minds Rising, Spirits Turning'.

Artistic Directors Defne Ayas and Natasha Ginwala have announced the artists, theme, and format for the 13th Gwangju Biennale. The exhibition takes place across multiple venues in Gwangju, Korea, from 26 February until 9 May 2021.

Entitled *Minds Rising, Spirits Turning*, the event will explore myriad ways of coming together to survive threats such as cognitive capitalism, algorithmic violence, and planetary imperialisms.

Altogether, 69 artists will take part, with 41 new works commissioned especially for the exhibition.

Ayas and Ginwala said they sought to include artists whose practices 'enable mutating, itinerant, hybrid, and at times undisciplined alliances.'

'As such,' they continued, 'we are committed to artists with mind-expanding and everinclusive practices, those that act beyond the binary framings of insider and outsider, legal and illegal, masculine and feminine, that are each invested in interdisciplinary frameworks traversing ancestral knowledge, augmented intelligence, and healing systems.'

Among the artists taking part are Indonesian conceptual artist Timoteus Anggawan Kusno, Chilean poet and artist <u>Cecilia Vicuña</u>, and American technologist <u>Lynn</u> <u>Hershman Leeson</u>. Hershman Leeson's work *Shadowstalker* (2019), pictured above, uses the algorithm behind Predpol—a system already in use by US police departments to predict where future crimes might occur—to highlight the potential biases of such high tech tools.

The Gwangju Biennale's exhibitions and even will be held at the Gwangju Biennale Exhibition Hall, Gwangju National Museum, Gwangju Theater, and Yangnim Mountain —Horanggasy Artpolygon. Its other constituent parts include: the *Minds Rising* editorial platform, the *Stronger Than Bone* publication, and online forum *GB Talks | Rising to the Surface: Practicing Solidarity Futures*, which began in September and continues until January 2021.
