It is "The People of Wau'' by well-known. versatile and mobile Filipina painter, Pacita Abad. Colourful, expressive and vivacious brush strokes have been executed in all Pacita's works. They reflect the inner self of this 32year-old artist, whose work has been displayed widely in America, Africa and Asia. This exhibition, depicting a small, remote area in Africa, marks her fifth one-

Born, raised and reducated in the Philipv pines she went off to America and earned a Master's degree and worked as art coordinator at the University of San Franciso. Her formal art training was completed at the famed Corcoran School of Art in Washington DC and the Art Students League of New York

And despite the fact that most of her formal training has been in woman show. seeses an western countrieso Pacita's worksbare native in their nature. Theor Guatemalan jungles, villages in Bangladesh, fishermen on the Philippine islands, and the tribal people of Southern Sudan -these are exquisitely and masterly portrayed in all the paintings to be on display starting tomorrow until November 24.
