Pacita constantly traveled around the globe for the past 25 years and her having experienced different cultures made a significant impact in her style of creating art of diverse imagery, using monoprints, limited edition prints and mixed media pieces embedded with beads, mirrors, textiles and other exotic objects she collected in her travels.
